Literature searches

Online (subscription) databases available in the Society's Library*

GeoRef – The American Geological Institute's geoscience database contains more than 1.5 million records covering North America since 1785 and all other areas worldwide since 1933.

Petroleum Abstracts – Available online from 1998 and from 1964-1998 on CD-ROM. This is the most comprehensive database available for petroleum exploration.

IMMAGE – Produced by the Institution of Materials, Minerals & Mining (IoM3). The

IMMAGE database contains over 75,000 references to the scientific and engineering literature of the international minerals industry published since 1979.



International Civil Engineering Abstracts – This database provides access to an archive of over 70,000 article abstracts dating back to 1976.

Staff can undertake searches on behalf of Fellows or Corporate Affiliate employees unable to visit the Library. Please submit requests on the relevant form (available online or on request). Charges apply.

* Non-Fellows may pay to use these databases when visiting the Library or should visit the British Library's Science Reading Room to access them.

Free Online Literature Search Databases

Useful for multidisciplinary subject searches outside 'pure' geology. e.g. environmental issues. Their scope may be restricted e.g. By publisher, subject or date. Check each site for details.

An aggregation of journals from the major US and European geoscience societies. Search for papers simultaneously in all these publications. Abstracts included. Full text (generally from the year 2000 only) available to subscribers and to all on a 'pay-per-view' basis.

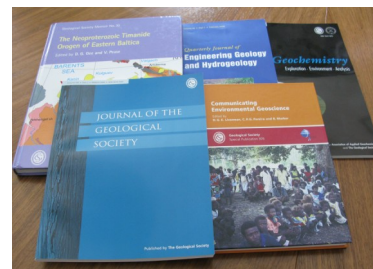
A simple to use site not limited to science. Includes peer-reviewed papers, theses and books from publishers, academic organisations, etc.

Hosts all the Geological Society's publications from its earliest *Transactions* in 1811 to the present day. Full text available to Fellows (dependent on 'chosen' membership journal) and subscribers, with a 'pay-per-view' option for all.
