



Glossop Award – Guidance Notes

1. The submitted abstract shall outline a case history that demonstrates your engineering geological input into a project. The submitted abstract shall demonstrate the following:
 - Outline of the topic, demonstrating its engineering geological significance.
 - A clear understanding of the background of the site, including the geology and hydrogeology.
 - The link between the engineering geology and the proposed/ final engineering solution.
 - Clear demonstration of your input in to the project.
2. CVs should be attached with your application form and should demonstrate your career progression to date, drawing on your engineering geological experience.
3. Proof of membership of the Geological Society and year joined (i.e. Fellow)
4. Confirmation that you are under training for, or already a Chartered Geologist.
5. Successful applicants will be invited to give a power point presentation to the Glossop panel, on their contribution to their chosen project. The presentation should be no longer than 20 minutes. Following the presentation there will short period of questions from the Glossop panel.
