What is it?

The Glossop award is a prestigious award made annually to an outstanding young engineering geologist. The winner will receive up to £150 for a Geological Society Special Publication of their choice or attendance at a training course or field meeting supported or run by the Engineering Group.

Who can apply?

You must be a Fellow of the Geological Society and under training for, or already a Chartered Geologist and not older than 30 years of age on 1st November 2011.

When?

The successful candidate will present their work at the Glossop Meeting to be held at the premises of the Royal Geographical Society, London on 23rd November 2011, before the Glossop Lecture.

What do you do?

To enter, submit a short abstract (500 words) to David Waring, EGGS Secretary, Atkins Limited, Woodcote Grove, Ashley Road, Epsom, Surrey, KT18 5BW, outlining a case history illustrating your role as an engineering geologist in an engineering or environmental project. Short listed candidates will be required to present their paper in front of a selection panel at Burlington House. To enter fill out the application form overleaf and send it with a brief abstract.

Rules for the Glossop Award

The Glossop Award is a short presentation before the Glossop Lecture by a young engineering geologist, not older than 30 years of age on the 1st November 2011.

The candidate must be a fellow of the Geological Society and either proceeding to Chartered Geologist professional qualification, or already a Chartered Geologist.

The candidate must obtain the nomination of his/her employer and must be available to give the presentation on the designated evening. The winner's employer will be given use of exhibition space at the Glossop meeting.

Applications must be made on the above form and require an abstract of 500 words (no figures or illustrations), as well as a CV, to be submitted by 30th June 2011.

Short listed candidates will be notified by mid July and must be available at the end of July to attend an interview at the Geological Society Burlington House. They should be prepared to give an outline presentation, including visual aids, to the selection panel.
