BEHIND-THE-SCENES PALAEONTOLOGY WORKSHOP PART 3 OUATERNARY PLEISTOCENE

(also Puddingstones and prehistoric struck-stone flakes)

Burymead Museum Resource Centre, Hitchin

The Museum Resource Centre is part of Hitchin Museum but it is located in an industrial estate away from Hitchin Museum. It holds about 10,000 specimens of rocks, fossils and minerals and natural history specimens (the entire collection of Hitchin Museum and Letchworth Museum).

John will facilitate this workshop after an introductory talk by the Cultural Services Manager of Burymead Museum Resource Centre. Those attending will have the opportunity to handle and study the fossil specimens which have not yet been on display to the public.

Part 3 of this palaeontology workshop series will specifically look at Quaternary Pleistocene fossil specimens collected mainly within Hertfordshire, including the Interglacial vertebrate fossils of the Order *Bovidae*, Order *Proboscodea*, and Family *Cervidae* of the Order *Artiodactyla* from the Hitchin Lake Beds and the Bayford Gravel Beds, and plant, vertebrate and invertebrate glacial erratic fossils of Hertfordshire plus fossil specimens collected in the Red Crag Formation at the base of the Pleistocene in Suffolk.

In addition, John will show some Hertfordshire Puddingstone specimens, and non-artefact prehistoric struck-stone flakes collected from the 2008 archaeology excavation at Fordham Hall Farm village in Essex. This will be followed by a short talk on the typology of saddle querns and the production of Hertfordshire Puddingstone rotary querns.


For those members attending this workshop, it may be possible to see and handle a particular taxonomic order of fossils or fossils from a particular stratigraphic formation from the Museum Resource Centre shown at the two previous HCNRG workshops by arrangement with John on the day, for examples, the Kimmeridgian fossils or the fossil specimens of the Order *Echinodea*.
