South Street Caves

- ♦ Many of the shops and houses in Dorking have extensive cellars and inter-connecting galleries some of which date back to medieval times. The South Street Caves form part of this system and are thought to have been used to store wine, groceries etc. as they remain at 14°C all year round. This will be an opportunity to see the medieval well shafts and the galleries thought to have been excavated in the 17th and 19th centuries.
- ◆ The tour will last about 45 minutes and will be led by two volunteer Guides from Dorking Museum & Heritage Centre.
- ◆ Please be aware that access requires visitors to be fit enough to descend and climb a 12 metre staircase. Hard hats must be worn (these will be provided).
- ◆ There is a charge of £5 per head payable to one of the SERG Committee on arrival.
