Climate change is a well established scientific fact, typically backed by over 97% of climate scientists researching the subject. However it continues to dominate news and current affairs as politicians around the world deny climate change's existence, often for political gain. In this talk we will outline the scientific basis behind climate change from first principals, outline the most common arguments against climate change, review climate model predictions for our world, and look at what the potential impacts for the West Midlands are in terms of social, economic and geotechnical challenges.

About the speaker

Murray Hoggett is a researcher in Geophysics at the University of Birmingham. He researches volcanology, petroleum systems and deep earth climate change using remote sensing, field work and mathematical modelling.
