

We are delighted to announce that we have arranged a new online subscription to <u>Tectonics</u> for Fellows of the Society.


Published monthly by the American Geophysical Union, *Tectonics* focuses on the evolution, structure, and deformation of Earth's lithosphere. Fellows can now view, download and read all issues from 1997 onwards using Athens Log-ins.

Athens Log-ins can also be used to access more than 100 other e-journals and 20 e-books from leading publishers. Titles recently added include Geological Magazine and Journal of palaeontology.

Specifically designed for members of <u>Corporate Affiliate companies</u>, the open day is an opportunity for you to:


- Meet the Library staff
