

Event: Inspirational Women of the Learned Societies




You are invited to join us to celebrate International Women's Day (Tuesday 8th March) with a unique behind-the-scenes tour of the Learned Societies of Burlington House.

London's Water Supply - a new exhibition



As part of the Geological Society's <u>Year of Water</u> celebrations, a new exhibition has been created in the Lower Library at Burlington House.

Clean Water for London introduces some key figures of 19th Century hydrogeology who led the way in researching and sourcing an adequate supply of drinking water for the capital. The display includes Joseph Prestwich's map of water-bearing strata around London, the first British geological map

to show hydrogeological information.

The exhibition can be viewed in the Lower Library and Lyell Room at the Geological Society, Burlington House, Piccadilly, London, W1J 0BG until 4th March.
