GSL Archives - explore the history of geology




The Geological Society's archive holds an internationally important collection of letters, diaries, field books and other items relating to the work of 19th and early 20th century geology, as well as some later material.

You can now quickly and easily view records of what is held on the new <u>online Archive Catalogue</u>, where you'll also find collection highlights, images of some items and useful links relating to the history of geology. From the letters of Roderick Murchison and the fossil drawings of Etheldred Benett to the history of plate tectonics, the archive is a rich seam of geological heritage waiting to be discovered.



Fellows can now access these journals from the first issues in the 1960s to the present day using their Athens login.



#### Four new e-books - free for Fellows


We have recently added four titles to the Library's collection of <u>over 50 e-books</u> which are available free to Fellows using Athens logins.


# From the Map Room - Geological Maps of Japan

The Library's copy of Christopher Packe's *A new philosophico chorographical chart of East-Kent* (1743) features in a new exhibition at Cambridge University Library.

<u>Landscapes Below: Mapping and the New Science of Geology</u> explores geological map making in the late eighteenth and early nineteenth centuries and how new subterranean visions of the British landscape influenced our understanding of the Earth. Packe's chart is one of the oldest in the Society's collection and was ground-breaking for its time - <u>view a copy on our Picture Library</u>.

The exhibition is open until 29 March 2018 at Milstein Exhibition Centre, Cambridge University Library, West Road, Cambridge CB3 9DR. Admission free.
