Gold Rush Treasure Hunt - book now!


Join us on Friday 27 July for <u>Gold Rush! A</u> <u>Geological Time-Travelling Treasure Hunt</u>.

Find clues hidden around our historic building, unravel the mysteries of the geological timescale, plot your answers on the treasure map and find the Curator's gold!



Scaling the Heights in the Library

In June, two intrepid explorers climbed the Library's shelves, ladders and galleries as part of *Scaling the Heights*, a project by artist Stephen Livingstone and others to recreate heroic Himalayan mountain climbs in miniature.

Working with Dr. Abbie Garrington of Durham University, the artists are restaging pioneering expeditions using a pair of vintage Action Men figures who scale the heights of prestigious libraries. The photographs will form part of an exhibition at Durham University Oriental Museum which opens in September.

With impressive attention to detail, including hand crafted costumes and a bespoke model airplane, the artists spent a day recreating the 1960 Swiss Expedition to climb Dhaulagiri in Nepal.
