In May 1919 the first eight women were elected to the Society. In May 2019, the Society celebrated 100 Years of Female Fellows and throughout the year we highlighted the work of our pioneering early members, as well as celebrating the contributions they have made to the geosciences before and since.

Our latest Special Publication is a follow-up volume to *The Role of Women in the History of Geology*.

Online First enables individual book articles to appear online soon after they have been accepted for publication and ahead of publication of the final volume.
