



Two new online exhibitions



The Library's latest online exhibition, <u>The Society's Portrait and Bust</u> <u>Collection</u>, focuses on the paintings and sculptures of Fellows and distinguished individuals which are displayed around the rooms and staircase of the Society's apartments in Burlington House.

The exhibition gives an introduction to the sitters depicted and their connections with our organisation, from Mary Anning to Henry Woodward.

Historic images from British Library



The British Library have released over a million images onto Flickr Commons for anyone to use, remix and repurpose without copyright infringement. The images are from the pages of 17th, 18th and 19th century books and are searchable through keywords. Of particular interest to geologists will be the wonderful historical maps, geological diagrams and illustrations. The images were plucked from pages as part of the 'Mechanical Curator', a creation of the British Library Labs project. Each image is individually addressible online, and Flickr provides an API to access it and the image's associated description.
