Bishnah needs to be developed as satellite town: Adv Bhardwaj

JAMMU, June 29: Senior Advocate, Mohinder Bhardwaj while addressing a largely attended meeting of prominent Congress workers and citizen of Bishnah Legislative Assembly Constituency has said that Bishnah being the artery of Jammu city needs to be developed as a satellite town for which a comprehensive plan should be conceived with a focus on agro-economy to develop its large swath of rural areas.

Bhardwaj expressed concern that despite its proximity to Jammu, Bishnah has remained neglected during two successive tenures of its elected representatives in the past. Time has come to build pressure on the State Government to take up this project on priority basis, he added.

In fact, Bishnah should be developed in such a manner so as to become a model for future development of towns around Jammu on the lines of National Capital Region of Delhi. Such a move will benefit people of not

only Bishnah and adjoining areas but the entire Jammu zone, he said.

Offering his wholehearted support and services to the people of Bishnah in this endeavour to develop it into a model township, he said such a project will automatically generate more employment opportunities away from the Government sector and help tide over the serious problem of unemployment being faced by the youth in the area.

One held with 40 kg nagchatri

KPs criticise linking their return to Valley with money, jobs

NEW DELHI, June 29:

Ahead of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to Jammu and Kashmir, Kashmiri Pandits today said their return and rehabilitation to the Valley cannot be addressed without recognising the fact that they were subjected to "religious cleansing and genocide" which eventually lead to their displacement.

They criticised the move to link the return of the exiled community to the Valley with only money, jobs and land.

"It is even bigger reason for alarm. This is a renewed attempt to sell the same non-solutions that the old Congress governments have been attempting in the past," Roots in Kashmir, the frontline organisation of the exiled Kashmiri Pandits, said in a release here.

"Such attempts tend to reduce our exodus from the Valley to some kind of a natural calamity like famine, flood or earthquake," it said after a 'Round Table Conference' in Delhi, where the leading Kashmiri Pandit organisations and individual activists were invited.

According to a unanimous resolution passed by the participants representing the community, "Addressing the issue of return and rehabilitation of Kashmiri Hindus in any other concocted context only compounds the problem and is tantamount to denial of genocide."

It said the Government should recognise the problem of

"uprootment of Kashmiri Hindus as genocide and invoke the covenants of prevention of genocide."

The Pandits also demanded creation of a tribunal on the pattern of Nuremberg trials "to bring the perpetrators of genocide of Kashmiri Hindus to justice."

They demanded that Kashmiri Hindus be rehabilitated at one centrally administered territory in Kashmir valley.

"A sustainable and permanent return of Kashmiri Hindus will be possible only in such a dispensation," the resolution said.

It was resolved that accession of Jammu and Kashmir to India is final and irrevocable. The round table was attended by Agnishekar, Convenor Panun Kashmir and Ajay Chungroo, Chairman Panun Kashmir, Rakesh Razdan, Vice President, Kashmiri Samiti Delhi, Amit Raina, Coordinator, APMCC, Kundan Kashmiri, President, Kashmiri Pandit Conference, Veerji Wangoo, President, Youth for Panun Kashmir, Sh. Sunil Shakkdar, Chairman S K Foundation and Pavitra Handoo, Former President Kashmir Overseas Association.

Ashish Zutshi, Roots in Kashmir, R K Mattoo, Former Editor, The New Indian Express, S S Toshkhani, well known Poet, Linguist, writer and scholar, and P L Razdan and Ashok Zalpuri, a known community activist also attended the conference. (PTI)

Army Chief to visit China from Wednesday

BEIJING, June 29:

Army Chief General Bikram Singh will be in China on a rare visit on Wednesday during which he will hold talks with top brass of the Chinese military, foreign ministry officials besides addressing the Chinese military academy.

General Singh will be the second Army Chief to visit China from July 2-5. His visit is taking place after a nine year gap. Former Army chief Gen NC Vij had visited China in 2005.

General Singh, also chair of the committee of chiefs of staff of the Indian armed forces, will hold talks with General Fan Changlong, the Vice Chairman of China's Military Commission, officials here said today.

The Commission which is the highest military body in China is headed by Chinese President Xi Jinping.

General Fan oversees the operations of army, navy and the air force.

General Singh's talks are expected to be focussed on firm-

ing up ties between the two militaries at the level of headquarters, Command levels as well as at the ground level along the disputed boundary.

His visit comes amid recurring incursions by Chinese troops along the 4,000 km Line of Actual Control (LAC) to assert China's claim in the areas.

To deal with tensions arising out of the incursions by both sides, India and China signed the Border Defence Cooperation Agreement (BDCA) last year.

His visit is aimed at implementing a number of steps incorporated in BDCA on the ground, officials said.

Singh will also meet top officials of Chinese Foreign Ministry and address PLA Academy, a rare honour for an Indian General.

His talks with Chinese officials would cover bilateral ties, regional security and other issues of common concern, spokesman of the Chinese Defence Ministry Yang Yujun told Chinese media during a briefing here. (PTI)
