CALLING ALL BUDDING PHOTOGRAPHERS OF THE EAST MIDLANDS!

To tie in with **Earth Sciences Week (13th - 19th October 2014)** Loughborough University will be launching a Photography Competition for **Key Stage 3 pupils in the East Midlands.**

THEME:

Your photograph should be centred around '**GEO-HERITAGE**', the theme for Earth Sciences Week. A geosite could be anything which highlights the importance of geology to our lives - a beautiful landscape, an engineered site, a museum, historical site or structure featuring striking building stones.

RULES:

Entries must be entirely the original work of the entrant and must never have been previously published, self-published, published online, broadcast nor winning or placed in any other competition. All entries should be from Key Stage 3 pupils enrolled in a school in the East Midlands. Limited to one entry per pupil. Pupils whose parents or immediate family are employed by Loughborough University are not permitted to enter the competition.

HOW TO ENTER:

Each entry should be printed one side of A4. On the reverse of each entry, your name, year group, and the name and address of your school should be clearly written. The photographs will not be returned, so please keep a copy.

DEADLINE:

All photographs must be received by no later than Friday 28th November. The winner will be announced on Friday 19th December via our website.

PRIZES:

First prize will be the fantastic opportunity to have your photograph published in 'University News', the official Loughborough University community magazine with a readership of 24,000 people, as well as a Nikon Coolpix digital camera. Two runners-up will win Amazon vouchers. The competition judge will be Professor Jo Bullard, Professor of Physical Geography in Loughborough University Geography Department and Phil Wilson, Senior Photographer in Design and Print Services. The judges' decision will be final.
