

Earth Science Week Geotrail around Richmond Park

In an urban environment it is often difficult to 'see' the geology beneath our feet. This is also true within our open spaces. In Richmond Park there is not much in the way of actual rocks to be seen but it is an interesting area geologically as several different rock types occur there. We will take clues from the landscape to see what lies beneath. Richmond Park affords fine views to both west and east which will throw a wider perspective on the geology of London.

This will be a circular walk of about 7 km, beginning and ending at the Kingston Gate car park. We will stop for lunch in Pembroke Lodge, approximately half-way round.

Meet 10.30 in the Car Park at Kingston Gate TQ 193 706 (nearest station is Norbiton, which is a 15-minute walk and buses 57, 85, 213, 371 pass a short walk away)
