PROFESSIONAL & CAREER DEVELOPMENT

The Society provides Fellows with a range of services to aid professional and career development.

Chartership

Fellows can apply for professional qualifications such as Chartered Geologist (CGeol) and Chartered Scientist (CSci). Both require high standards of knowledge, competence and professionalism and are recognised in the UK and a number of other countries.

Other benefits of Chartership include:

- Access to further qualifications such as:
 - SiLC (Specialist in Land Condition)
 - RoGEP (Register of Ground Engineering Professionals)
 - CSCS cards (Construction Skills Certification Scheme)
- Chartered Geologist status is a prerequisite to be a 'competent person' under the PERC and many other international reserves and resources reporting codes in the CRIRSCO family
- As a Chartered Geologist you can apply for the highly regarded title of European Geologist (EurGeol)
- Chartered Geologists can join the American Association of Petroleum Geologists (AAPG), the American Institute of Professional Geologists (AIPG) and the Institute of Geologists of Ireland (IGI), using the Society's reciprocal arrangements





LIBRARY SERVICES

The Geological Society houses one of the largest collections of geological literature in the world, with around 300,000 volumes of books and serials and over 40,000 maps. The Geological Society Library is a research library, which offers its Fellows the best of both worlds: rich historical and archive collections as well as the most up-to-date information resources in print and electronic formats. We currently subscribe to over 600 journal titles. Our Library provides users with a range of services including:

- Free access to 100+ e-journals and over 50 e-books available onsite or remotely
- Online Library catalogue to search books, journals and maps, renew and request items, view loan history and create bibliographies
- Loans (including via post) of books, journals and maps
- Access to the Map Room
- Document delivery and inter-library loan services
- Literature search and enquiry services
