

Directions

By car: for SatNavs, use AL3 4SW. The museum is about 6 minutes drive from St Albans Town Centre, accessible via St Michael's Street or off Bluehouse Hill (the A4147). Please note you cannot turn right off here, if you are heading north and will need to go up to the roundabout and turn around.

On foot: we are about a 20 minute pleasant walk from the Town Centre - you can walk all the way down George Street, then Fishpool Street - some of the oldest streets in the city, or come via the Abbey and Verulamium Park.

By train: St Albans is on two train lines - the Thameslink line to St Albans City (Bedford/Brighton/London), about a 30 minute walk away + the Abbey Flyer line from Watford Junction to St Albans Abbey, about 20 mins walk through the Park.

Parking

There is a pay and display NCP car park right in front of the museum which has 150 spaces, including 7 disabled bays and 2 coach spaces and is open 24 hours. Additional public car parks are available at Westminster Lodge leisure centre at the bottom of Holywell Hill, or in the town centre (both a pleasant 15 min walk across the park). There are also a handful of spaces on King Harry Lane (Bluehouse Hill end).
