


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Welcome

In 2015 we will be subscribing to over 100 electronic journals via [Athens passwords](#), which Fellows of the Society can access from their desktop and in the Library.

The most recent title to be made available is [Antarctic Science](#), which publishes papers on a variety of topics including environmental management, volcanoes, icebergs, and oceanography. The [December 2014 issue](#) is devoted to Antarctic geosciences, and has many papers on glaciology.


We have access to a worldwide network of libraries, with close working relationships built over many years, which allows us to provide material not held in UK libraries (in 2014 we sourced books from as far afield as Sydney, Oslo, Austin and Ottawa). Our prices are cheaper than other providers such as the British Library and with our personalised service you will always be dealing directly with a member of staff who can keep you up-to-date on the

progress of the loan.

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William Smith material in our Picture Library



2015 marks the two hundredth anniversary of William Smith's famous 'Geological map of England and Wales with part of Scotland', the [first geological map of an entire country](#).

To celebrate this occasion we have made images of maps, sections and other material relating to Smith from the Geological Society collections [publicly available online](#) for the first time. From Smith's early geological map of Bath, to his plans for water-meadows and canals, and his beautiful and intricate drawings of fossils, you can now explore a fascinating range of images relating to 'The Father of English geology', all accompanied by informative biographical and historical notes.

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Packe Map of Kent digitised




We have recently digitised one of the oldest maps in our collection, Christopher Packe's 'A New Philosophico Chorographical Chart of East-Kent'.

Dating from 1743, prior to the invention of the modern geological map as we know it, this chart shows the location of various important geological resources, such as building stones and springs, and has a polar co-ordinate system with the origin at Canterbury giving the bearing and distance to each resource.


